A time of transition


DOE has been doing some D&D projects for awhile now, demolishing unneeded buildings, addressing contamination, etc. For example, the demolition of the X-533 switchyard, the X-633 pump house, and the X-760 lab building.

DOE's near term work needs are for characterization and evaluation of conditions. In the summer of 2011, DOE plans to do some sampling & characterization work in the process buildings to help them better evaluate, select, and execute later CERCLA activities that will address risks and hazards. Work that started with Cold Shutdown will also continue.

DOE's long term work needs will be to address the actual contaminated facilities, once they are characterized.



How will this work?



Since DOE will perform its D&D work under CERCLA, we'll be looking at the DOE-built environment under CERCLA too

The strategy for putting it all together under CERCLA is as follows:

- Under CERCLA, compliance with laws like the National Historic Preservation Act occur as a part of the CERCLA process
- CERCLA has various opportunities for public involvement
- CERCLA documents receive public notice and public review
- In addition to your opportunity to review when documents are issued, there is the added opportunity now, before there's a CERCLA document to review
- We would expect the SSAB subcommittee to make a recommendation to the full SSAB
- Consulting parties can also consolidate their ideas and submit to DOE, or keep them as independent ideas

Throughout the CERCLA process DOE will:

- Evaluate the options submitted
- Consider them for incorporation into the CERCLA documents that are in development

✓ What are we already doing?

- Documentation with photos, plans, drawings, and records
- Establishment of an archive for preservation purposes including a searchable database and curation of items and materials
- Oral History Project
- Identification and collection of unique items to set aside for future display or exhibit purposes
- Special panoramic photographs
- Educational opportunities via the Virtual Museum website
