<b>Question/Comment:</b>	<b>Answer:</b>
<b>Brushart</b> asked the OU school is very much involved, they have done a lot of work, research. Are you talking with them?	<b>Schneider</b> stated FLUOR is working with OU on the outreach. They have shared a lot of information. <b>Jamison</b> (FBP CEO) has made it a requirement for all of the leaders at FLUOR B&W to join an organization in the area. <b>Miller</b> stated OU has talked to several stakeholders in the four county areas.
<b>Manson</b> stated it is hard to get the message out, unless it effects the pocketbook, the community does not listen.	<b>Miller</b> stated OU has put ads in the newspaper, attended County Fairs and etc.
<b>Payton</b> stated the best way to get to people is at places like the Jackson Apple Festival, Pumpkin Show in Circleville things like that. Face to face is the best way to get information out there.	<b>Price</b> stated Fluor is planning to use the Envoy Program, which is having a key person in each stakeholder group, and have that person be a liaison to take information back to the group from FLUOR. We like to use someone that is already a member of the group.
<b>Minter</b> asked should this committee talk about the student liaison that the executive subcommittee talked about at the last meeting.	<b>Roberts</b> stated we have been working on a draft recommendation for a student liaison, we will send a copy to the subcommittee. <b>Miller</b> stated OU has a program that instead of completing a thesis the student would work with an organization, do a project with them, and write a report on that project.
<b>Galanti</b> asked when you say Site Risk-Based End State Vision what does that mean. It should be changed to something like Community Based Future Use. We also do not use the words Energy Park now it is Asset Revitalization.	<b>Miller</b> stated the OU report would be out end of September, which falls right in your time schedule.
<b>Roberts</b> asked when you say SODI lead is that SODI funded?  I feel the subcommittee should put something in writing about DOE listening to your recommendation 0001 by having FLUOR include your ideas into the community Plan for FLUOR. Maybe just state that you support it.	<b>Schneider</b> stated no it does not mean SODI funded. FLUOR will be happy to brief you on what is going on anytime. <b>Simonton</b> stated the FLUOR Community Plan does fit with what you ask for.
<b>Brushart</b> stated if anyone has some ideas on this recommendation, please send them to the SSAB office.

# Portsmouth Gaseous Diffusion Plant (GDP) Decontamination & Decommissioning (D&D) Contract

- Demolition and disposal of GDP facilities, including the three main process buildings
- Remediation of groundwater and contaminated soil
- Exploration of option (subject to approval) for onsite disposal cell
- Completion of two CERCLA Records of Decision (RODs)
- Release of suitable clean areas for reindustrialization



# Public Engagement Program



- Building on existing successful Portsmouth site programs and previous work of Portsmouth SSAB
- Meeting prescriptive CERCLA public involvement requirements driven by regulatory agreements, schedules
- Bringing public engagement best practices from other projects and sites

- Designing FBP public engagement program around three principles:
  - Management Involvement
  - Person-to-Person Communication
  - Strong Public Information Program

# Near-Term Regulatory Activities




- Optimizing Director's Final Finding & Orders (DFF&O) to accelerate decision-making process






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# Commitment to Economic Development
