1. Presentation-Future Land Use Footprint-Karen Price-Fluor B&W:

Questions from Frank Halstead

- How much of the site has been characterized industrial?
- Of the five major landfills, how many are characterized industrial?
- Are the landfills going to be cleaned up to industrial standards because they were made by DOE?
- What is the classification of the prairie area?
- How many restricted areas are there that will not be returned to at least industrial standards?

SSAB Information Portfolio Future Vision Planning

- Current Site
- No buildings; landfills and plumes remain
- Future vision but landfills and plumes remain
- Future vision with landfill consolidation

2. Discussion:

Question/Comment:	Answer:
Snyder: To clean up the drinking water to an industrial level, you have to clean up the groundwater to potable standards.	Bradburne: The cleanup level has not been determined yet. Price: Nothing is releasable yet.
Brushart: Can the landfills be cleaned up?	Price: Yes, but right now they are closed.
Renner: We would be able to take the soil from the current landfills and use it for fill in the on-site cell. Do we have a time line for the Edison group to come and present to the full board?	Galanti: The plumes take 130 years to pump and treat. The geology makes it take a long time to clean up. Simonton: Yes, we just talked to them. They can come in June or July.

Renner: At the National Chairs meeting, I helped write a recommendation on budgets. I have to submit it to headquarters soon, but I would like you to look at it and make any suggestions before Friday.

Roberts: This is a national recommendation. It is to be turned into headquarters by the end of May. It will then be presented and voted on at the next EM National Chairs tele-con on June 6 at 3 p.m. If it passes then it will come back to the local boards for approval. Cristy you should be complimented on your work.

Craft: This national recommendation looks great.
