

What is the Science Bowl?

- A highly competitive science education and academic event sponsored by DOE
 - Seeks to encourage students to expand their knowledge of math and science
 - Raises visibility of academic achievement in the sciences
 - Attracts more than 14,000 students nationwide, including more than 10,000 at the high school level in 2012





What is the Science Bowl?

- Competition Overview
 - National event now in its 23rd year
 - High School and Middle School components
 - Teams are comprised of:
 - 4 players
 - 1 alternate
 - 1 coach
 - Regional science bowl championship team receives an all-expense paid trip to compete at the national event in Washington DC April 25-29, 2013

- Competition Overview (continued)
 - High school students are quizzed on the following topics at the regional and national levels:
 - Biology
 - Chemistry
 - Physics
 - Earth and space science
 - Energy
 - Math





The Regional Competition

- Location
 - Campus of Shawnee State University in Portsmouth
- Date
 - Friday, March 8th, 2013
- Format (Brackets)
 - Morning – Teams compete in Round Robin pool tournaments (4 or 5) to determine seeding for afternoon play
 - Check-in begins at 8:00 a.m. with official welcome at 8:30 a.m.
 - Pool play will begin at 9:00 a.m.
 - Afternoon – Single-elimination tournament resulting in a Regional Champion / National Qualifier



The Regional Competition



- Format (Matches)

- 8-minute halves with a 2-minute intermission
- 2 types of questions will be used
 - Toss-up
 - Bonus



- Format (Officials)


- Each competition room will be staffed as follows:
 - Moderator – Responsible for controlling each match
 - Scientific Judge – Resolves question challenges
 - Scorekeeper – Awards points and records the score
 - Rules Judge – Ensures all competition rules are followed
 - Timekeeper – Operates the official competition time clock

NSB Competition Room Set-Up (Audience can see students faces)




