It's all about the schools

- **18 high schools from Pike, Ross, Jackson and Scioto counties involved in this year's competition**
- **156 students made up 32 teams vying for regional title**
 - 2013: 13 schools, 20 teams
 - 2014: 16 schools, 27 teams
- **Pike County Schools**
 - Waverly (2 teams; has competed in all 3 Science Bowls)
 - Western (2 teams; has competed in all 3 Science Bowls)
 - Piketon (1 team; second year competing)
 - Eastern (1 team; first year competing and began with a 3-0 record in morning pool play)
 - Pike County Career Technology Center (1 team; Ohio's first Joint Vocational School became the first school of this type to compete in the South Central Ohio Regional Science Bowl)

- **Ross County Schools**

- Chillicothe (2 teams; second team claimed the regional title)
- Huntington (1st year with 2 teams; went 0-4 last year before Team 1 won their pool play this year)
- Zane Trace (2 teams; has competed in all 3 Science Bowls with 1 regional title)

- **Jackson County Schools**

- Jackson (2 teams; has competed in all 3 Science Bowls)



- **Scioto County Schools**

- Glenwood (1 team; first team to register this year)
- Minford (2 teams; returned after a one-year hiatus with Team 1 claiming one of the four #1 seeds)
- Northwest (2 teams; has competed in all 3 Science Bowls)
- Notre Dame (2 teams; defending regional champion who has competed in all 3 Science Bowl)
- Portsmouth (2 teams; returned for a second year after missing the inaugural Science Bowl)
- Portsmouth West (2 teams; has competed in all 3 Science Bowls)
- Sciotoville East (2 teams; first year for a second team... has competed in all 3 Science Bowls)

 - Valley (2 teams; vocal supporter in teacher Randy McClay; has been involved in all 3 Science Bowls)




