<p>Galanti: The consent decree was from 1989. The last page says five years for cleanup.</p>	<p>Sea: Five years from shut down or five years</p>
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<p>Five years from the date it was signed.</p>	<p>from the date, it was signed?</p>
<p>Cisco: Thousands of soil samples have been done, were there any surprises? Does it migrate? Do you find it in different levels? What causes it to move? Just little things to think about. That is why you have to have so many samples.</p>	<p>Galanti: Yes, there has been a few surprises. TCE is heavier than water so it sits on top of the bedrock. Everything was in the X-701B holding pond. Years later after we had treated, there were trees growing and they had to take down the trees and bundle up the leaves and everything because the trees were contaminated. My first day I was on Fog Road watching them put in a trench because they had found out there was contamination from the holding pond there just on the other side of Perimeter Road to where I was standing on Fog Road, it had migrated so they were putting in a collection trench to treat it. That was in 1991. We are still collecting water and treating it today even though we did a very extensive treat long-term cleanup.</p>
<p>Hartley: Years ago they would just open the door and throw stuff out. That was the way it was done then. No one knew any better.</p>	<p>Galanti: There is a lot of contamination around and under the 700 buildings and we will not know how much or what until the pads are pulled up.</p>
<p>Sea: Karen I am surprised that you said we have past the decision of future use. No decisions have been made, what did you mean by that?</p>	<p>Price: I meant as far as the SSAB is concerned, they have decided the future use that they prefer. I mean type of user, industrial.</p>
